Dear Colleagues

The 2014 Annual General Meeting will celebrate the 30th anniversary of the founding of the IMO – your Trade Union. The event will take place from 24th to 26th April in Carton House, Co Kildare.

The last year has shown just how much this profession needs a Trade Union to represent it and we, as your Trade Union and representative body, are leading the way with our campaign for legal and safe working hours for NCHDs, defending the rights of GPs to be fully represented, fighting for fair treatment for new entrant consultants and defending the contractual rights of consultants, protecting the vital work of our public and community health doctors and seeking to have proper resources attach to this important service.

Over the past three decades the IMO has consistently been at the forefront promoting policy on a wide range of health and societal issues. Additionally the meeting will have a CPD (Continuing Professional Development) Programme which offers you, as an IMO member, an opportunity to avail of CPD Accreditation for these interesting and topical sessions. And, as already advised to members, the very way in which we in the IMO are to manage our own affairs into the future will be considered with a proposal from your Council on an new set of Rules and Code of Practice for the Organisation.

The IMO is a force for good and a voice for change – let your voice be heard and attend the 2014 AGM.
