11.30 – 12.00 Chronic disease management in reality

Anne-Eva Speeks (Netherlands, President of LOVAH) Carsten Mohrhardt (Germany, President of the EJD) The leading cause of mortality and morbidity in Europe are chronic diseases such as diabetes, cardio vascular disease, depression and many more. Recent studies show that up to 50% of the European population are suffering of at least one chronic disease, therefore proper management of these patients will be a challenge in the future.

12.00 – 13.00 Clusters & assessments – a new approach in Hungary

Gergely Fürjes (Hungary, Deputy Chief of Program)

In 2012 a pilot project to restructure primary care in Hungary was launched. One of the basic goals was to improve health services provide by GPs and other professionals in disadvantaged regions. Therefore four so called GP clusters were implemented, all of them in regions were access to health and prevention services was limited for the population. A core element of the new primary care system is the health assessment of the population in the intervention area to determinate the health status of the individual.
