- 23. Medical Records a supporting booklet might be useful to guide medical professionals with writing and maintaining medical records.
- 43. Children and Minors a supporting booklet would be useful to support physicians with consent to treatment of mature minors.
- 49. Health Resources As per 12 above the IMO are concerned about the impact of successive budget cuts on patient safety the guidance and the Medical Council must support doctors who have serious concerns about their ability to deliver safe care to patients with restricted resources.
- 50. Professional Indemnity -The IMO would advise all physicians to ensure they are adequately indemnified. Newly registered doctors should be advised on registration to take out clinical indemnity insurance.
- 53. Clinical Trials and Research This section should be updated to reflect the amended WMA Declaration of Helsinki Ethical Principles for Medical Research Involving Human Subjects.
- 54.5 Provision of Information to the Public and Advertising –The IMO and European medical professional bodies are concerned and opposed to the development of Standards in aesthetic surgery and non-surgery services by CEN (The European Committee of Standardisation) an industrial standards body. The concerns of the medical professional bodies in Europe have been previously expressed by the IMO to the Medical Council. There is an urgent need to ensure high standards and regulation of the advertising and provision of cosmetic and plastic surgery services at National level.

 56. Premises and Practice Information This may need updating to correspond with HIQA National standards for Safer, Better, Care.
